



**Community Partners for Child Safety – Region 13
Regional Service Council
August 1, 2022**

As of August 1, 2022, a total of 107 referrals had been received since May 1, 2022. A home-based caseworker (HBCW) was assigned to 107 cases, a home-based therapist (HBT) was assigned to 0 cases.

There are 64 levels currently being serviced through Community Partners for Child Safety to assist 64 families. The priority list was eliminated on 6/13/12.

Region 13 received a total of 35 referrals during the month of May. Of these referrals, 1 came from Brown County, 1 from Greene County, 13 from Lawrence County, 18 from Monroe County, and 2 from Owen County.

Region 13 received a total of 41 referrals during the month of June. Of these referrals, 1 came from Brown County, 2 from Greene County, 9 from Lawrence County, 27 from Monroe County, and 2 from Owen County.

Region 13 received a total of 31 referrals during the month of July. Of these referrals, 0 cases came from Brown County, 3 from Greene County, 14 from Lawrence County, 11 from Monroe County, and 3 from Owen County.

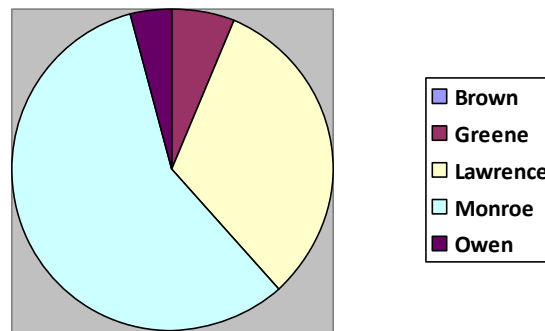

Success Story

This family was referred to Community Partners by DCS. The referral stated that mother needed assistance enrolling her child into therapy. Upon meeting with the family, it was identified that the child has been having behavioral issues. During sessions we were able to educate the family on coping skills and set some coping skills for everyone to practice. Then we discussed the behaviors that were taking place and the difficulty the children have with the consequences in place. From this we learned the children were not responding to the discipline techniques in place. IHBS educated the family on conscious discipline and gave examples of how to implement this into daily life. Mother was able to implement conscious discipline and noticed some changes. We also were able to get therapy services at Centerstone in place.
